FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR MOIRA

Dear CPC Family,

Christmas is long over. The ornaments and decorations are taken down for another year. Outside the trees are bare, the air is chilly; we're waiting for that first big snowstorm of the season.

Meanwhile, most of those New Year resolutions have flown out the window. It's dark when we leave the house in the morning; it's dark when we get back. We can't wait for Spring!

So where are we? What is this in-between place?

We're in the season of Epiphany. The time time of "making manifest." It began with the journey of the magi to the infant Jesus. But as we continue with the process of "revealing" – we see Jesus at the beginning of his ministry: getting baptized, attending a wedding, preaching in Nazareth, getting into trouble, calling disciples, teaching, reaching out and healing, living into his call as his fame grows throughout the countryside, and the light of God shines, every step of the way.

In our overcast, wintry days, we are invited to manifest our ministry. To join Jesus as he ministers, touches people, changes people's lives. In the dead of winter, we manifest the warmth of love and caring. We learn how to follow, how to be disciples. We uncover the precious gifts of CPC-Merrick, some of them shining brightly in our tender fellowship and inspiring worship. We begin to feel the quickening of those gifts not quite matured -- but definitely there – the

faithfulness of ministries to homeless and hungry, to children and youth, AA meetings, music, people stepping up and taking on roles to revitalize the CPC community.

All these acts of kindness have revealed the love and giftedness of the congregation, and its eagerness to serve the Lord and neighbor. All these are important themes for us to consider as we get ready to prepare for the season of Lent which falls on February 22. I would like to remind us of the goals to Draw Nearer to Jesus, following the example of the wisemen. At the beginning of Epiphany we talked about naming the "stars" that lead us to Jesus. We talked about naming the "Herods" or evil that blocks our way to Jesus. We talked about naming our "gifts" we will dedicated to Jesus in 2023. If you haven't filled out the worksheet we discussed at the beginning of January, it isn't too late! Reread Matthew 2: 1-12. In addition, you will find a copy of Drawing Nearer to Jesus 2023 worksheet included in this Tower Chimes. Reflect on how you are drawing nearer to Jesus as the weeks of Epiphany go by. What are you doing to manifest your gifts, in this season of Epiphany to build a foundation of a stronger spiritual life in 2023?

So where are we? We're in an exciting place. A Place of revelation. Of manifestation. Of Epiphany. We're right where we should be. As the "revealing" unfolds as we journey to Lent, let us see how, in even these cloudy, cold days of winter, the Light of God shines brightly in our hearts and in our church.

We all know that times are tough out there, and a hot meal can make all the difference in the world for a family in need. Please bear in mind that most public schools are closed for winter break which means that kids who are entitled to a free breakfast or lunch at school may go hungry without our help.

How horrifying is that?! Are you ready to give it your all to help our community and *kick* hunger to the curb? Good! — grab your supermarket ads, your coupon envelope and tell your family, friends and neighbors! The game is ON!! Let's *tackle* hunger!!

Our Deacons are again *quarterbacking* this project, and want to remind you that last year CPC collected 186 food items and \$3,303 in money bringing our 2022 total to 3,489. Let's not get *sidelined* this year. Let's try and *pass* our last year's total!

As a reminder, here's how the game works:

 Simply bring your food or money donation to church with you on Sundays or drop them off in the church office during the week. An area will be set up in the back of the Sanctuary from Feb. 1 – March 1 to receive your donations. Money is just as good as food items, so if it's easier for you to write a check, which might be the case this year due to the pandemic, please make it payable to Community Presbyterian Church with 'Souper Bowl of Caring' on the memo line). If you are donating actual 'cash', please **hand** it to one of our deacons, Pastor Moira, Gary, or Barbara in the office. If you want to make an **ANONYMOUS DONATION**, please just put it in an envelope marked 'Souper Bowl of Caring', and drop it in the mail slot to the office door or pop it in the regular mail. Barbara will add those numbers to the totals when she receives them.

Here's a quick recap of the rules:

- Non-perishable FOOD, MONEY and SUPERMARKET GIFT CARDS will be collected during the month of February.
- The contributions are tallied as such:

Cash/Check \$1 = 1\$ can of soupGrocery store gift cards \$1 = 1\$ can of soupNonperishable food items: \$1\$ package/can =

1 can of soup

Diapers 5 diapers = 1 can soup

(i.e., one package of 30 diapers = 6 soup cans

baskets and egg hunts, Lent can help your family focus on the real meaning of Easter and what Jesus' sacrifice means for our salvation


