Dear CPC Friends,

By the time I write this, I am aware that you probably know by now that session, because of the church's financial situation, has regrettably ended its almost 5-year partnership with the First Presbyterian Church of Freeport and will not be renewing my contract as pastor in April. This is not a decision I supported or asked for although, of course, I understand the rationale that has been given for the decision the Session has taken. Although my contract technically ends April 7, I am extending it to Easter Sunday so I can celebrate our Lord's resurrection one last time with you.

Lent is a time for introspection and seeking renewal. It is my prayer that the Merrick congregation deliberately seeks God's will for its future through prayer, fasting and ongoing mutual reflection. I hope to use the remaining weeks of my pastorate saying good-bye to each of you individually. It has been my great honor and privilege to serve you, and I will carry many precious memories as I, too, seek God's will for the next steps of my journey. You have helped to shape me as a pastor, and I hope to carry these lessons and memories with me as I go forward. Let us pray for each other as God leads us on.

Lent offers us many opportunities to walk with Jesus as he journeys to the cross: devotionals are being sent out weekly, and I hope they are a blessing to you; we are engaging in a weekly zoom bible study on Wednesdays at 12:30 pm entitled "Finding I Am;" on Wednesday evenings, we gather with local churches via zoom to explore "Sacred Cinema: Lenten Film Fest." (Each week a different pastor will discuss a film, and we will watch a clip and discuss its spiritual implications for our lives.) I hope you will take advantage of these opportunities for spiritual growth and renewal.

Thank you for enriching my life these past years. Know that you will always be in my prayers.

Our Flower Commissioner, Mary Leschinski, had decided to make available to everyone not only our standard lilies, azaleas and hydrangeas, but tulips and hyacinths as well. The lilies, hydrangeas and azaleas will be \$14 per plant, and you may order them from the form found in this Tower Chimes.

Mary will also make available to you tulips, hyacinths and mini daffodils.....in \$10 increments. Because it's too early to know the pricing for these flowers, Mary will buy for you as many plants as she can with each \$10 given to her with the remainder of each \$10 being donated to the Flower Fund. For example, tulips may be \$3.99 each at the time of purchase, so with your \$10, Mary would purchase 2 plants for you donating the change (\$2.02) to the Flower Fund. It is a tad confusing, so if you need further clarification, please either call Mary directly at 516-661-5017 or Barbara in the church office.

Out-of-towners may order flowers, too, by just filling out the form or calling the church office or Mary.

Please get your flower order (and dedication) in to Mary <u>by April 2.</u> Forms can be found are around the church and on the last page of this Tower Chimes.

You may take your flowers/plants home with you AFTER our Easter Sunday service, You may also designate that the Church may keep them. Thank you, and happy ordering!

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER - MARCH 3

The World Day of Prayer is celebrated on the first Friday of March each year to encourage Christian women to engage in personal prayer and lead communal prayer within their mission auxiliaries and associations. Women have a strong sense of identification with the needs of other women and children and are better suited to provide the appropriate support. Since 1861, despite strong resistance from the all-male mission boards, women have established a number of effective boards for foreign and home missions working directly with and for women and children. World Day of Prayer is an initiative of one such board, which aims to make the lives of women and children easier by offering resources and support.

History Of World Day Of Prayer: In the 19th century, Christian women of the U.S. and Canada began engaging in cooperative activities to support women's involvement in missions across the world. In 1887, Presbyterian women called for a day of prayer for home missions which the Methodist women joined from 1892 to 1894 after calling for a week of prayer. The Baptist started a day of prayer for foreign missions in 1891.

Forming a committee in 1897, women from six denominations would eventually start a united day of prayer for home missions. These women took turns in the other participating denominations and organized the common worship service. In 1912, the Woman's Board of Foreign Missions decided that there should be a united day of prayer for foreign missions that would be observed in different parts of the world.

After the success of the Ecumenical Missionary Conference in New York City in 1900, a group of laywomen organized an interdenominational Central Committee for United Study that prepared publications, summer conferences, study days, and courses so that women could be up-to-date about the lives of women in other parts of the world. These courses also enabled them to study biblical foundations and important issues related to mission work. Women took initiatives to organize interdenominational structures that were effective and cooperative in home and foreign missions. In

1908, the women founded the Council of Women for Home Missions that assumed responsibility for the rehabilitation of immigrants and other social issues, and for the preparation of the joint day of prayer. (Nationaltoday.com)

Passion / Palm Sunday begins Holy Week, a time in the church year when we remember how Christ gave his life in love for the world. As this service opens, the crowd waves palm branches, wanting to crown Jesus as king,

shouting "Hosanna, Hosanna." But as the story of the passion unfolds, their shouts of praise turn to demands for his crucifixion; he receives a crown of thorns as he is handed over to be mocked and killed.

On this day palms are received, and we participate in the One Great Hour of Sharing offering. Special OGHS offering envelopes will be included in the April Tower Chimes and will be available to you at all April worship services. Please mail your offering to the church or place it in an offering plate on any given Sunday in April. If you are writing a check, please write OGHS on the memo line with the check payable to the church.

OGHS is the single, largest way that Presbyterians join together to share God's love with our neighborsin-need around the world. Each gift helps to improve the lives of people in challenging situations through three impactful programs:

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA), *Restorers of Streets to Live In* works alongside communities as they recover and find hope after the devastation of natural or human-caused disasters. PDA receives 32% of funds raised.

Presbyterian Hunger Program (PHP), *Share Your Bread With the Hungry* takes action to alleviate hunger and the systemic causes of poverty so all may be fed. PHP received 36% of funds raised.

Self-Development of People (SDOP), *Lose the Bonds* of *Injustice* invests in communities responding to their experiences of racism, oppression, poverty, and injustice and educates Presbyterians about the impact of these societal ills. SDOP receives 32% of funds raised.

Join with Presbyterians worldwide in answering God's call. If we all do a little, it adds up to a lot!

THURSDAY is <u>April 6</u> this year, and CPC will be having a <u>7:00pm Last Supper Tenebrae</u> service in the Sanctuary. The

As you know, Good Friday is the day we remember Jesus' crucifixion.

What you may not know is that the hours of noon to 3 p.m. are particularly significant as these commemorate the time Jesus hung on the cross. It is an especially important time to pray for the church and the world for whom Christ gave his life.
